Off-campus employment	Eligible to apply for <u>"Curricular Practical Training" (CPT)</u> off-campus employment authorization after completing one academic year as a full-time student. 	 Employment must be related to your major field of study. Employment must be a degree requirement or required for course credit (see "Types of CPT" here). You must obtain authorization from BIO prior to beginning work. Please submit your request to BIO at least 2 weeks before your employment start date. You can work up to 20 hours a week. During vacation periods, there is no limit. There's more you need to know! Please review BIO's CPT page in full before applying for CPT. 	 Employment must be related to your major field of study. You must obtain authorization from BIO prior to beginning work. Please submit your request to BIO at least 2 weeks before your employment start date. You can work up to 20 hours a week. Employment after graduation	 Eligible to apply for Optional Practical Training (OPT). A job offer is not required to apply. Employment (once secured) must be directly related to your major field of study and at least 20 hours/week. You must obtain authorization from USCIS prior to beginning work. This can take 2-5 months, so APPLY EARLY! You can apply up to 90 days before your academic program end date. TIP for Seniors: There's a lot more you need to know! Review the OPT application process and timeline before your final semester begins. Resources: OPT page and OPT tutorial. 	 You must secure a job offer and apply for Academic Training before your academic program ends. Employment must be directly related to your major field of study and at least 20 hours/week. You must obtain authorization from BIO prior to beginning work. TIP for Seniors: There's a lot more you need to know! Review the Academic Training application process before your final semester begins.
